I congratulate *Jayden Viduya* (Grade 8), who has been selected to represent the Eastern Province Swimming Team at the SA Schools' championships in Bloemfontein this weekend. In addition, *Kellen Jones* continues to make great strides as he represents South Africa in the SA Junior Swimming Team, which will compete in the Africa Championships in Egypt in April. Proud moments for them both...and us!

It has been a long term, and finishing it in a strong position is essential - on every level.
